The New York State Commission for the Blind (NYSCB)

is Proud to Be Part of the American Council of the Blind of New York's Annual Convention

The NYSCB congratulates the American Council of the Blind of New York on its annual convention.

NYSCB provides vocational rehabilitation and other direct services to legally blind or deaf-blind New York State residents including children, adults, and older adults. The commission works closely with not-for-profit agencies for the blind throughout New York State to provide technical, educational and resource assistance to our participants. One of NYSCB's primary services is assisting participants in achieving economic self-sufficiency and full integration into society. NYSCB offers these services through seven district offices across New York State.

<u>Vocational Rehabilitation Program</u> – provides guidance and counseling to assist participants who are legally blind, find or retain employment.

<u>Business Enterprise Program</u> - provides training for blind vendors in operating food service facilities in federal and state buildings. Any New York State resident who is

legally blind or deaf-blind and is a United States citizen may be eligible for this program.

<u>Children's Program</u> - rehabilitation services to legally blind children between the ages of birth and 21. Early intervention, empowering parents, arranging services to supplement educational activities and ensuring a smooth transition to adult services

<u>Transition Program</u> - pre-employment transition services to students ages 14 to 21 and vocational rehabilitation services for all youth who are legally blind, including those with additional disabilities.

<u>Summer Socialization Skills Program</u> - summer camp and recreational opportunities for youth who are legally blind.

Equipment Loan Fund - helps to purchase equipment that will improve the quality of daily life.

<u>Independent Living Program</u> - helps individuals with low vision carry out day-to-day activities and assists them in living at home and in the community.
